Here is a recent testimony of a Life Center student

My name is Alina Barna, my family has twelve kids, I'm the fourth child born to this wonderful family. My youngest brother is seven, he is handicapped, and my brother before him is also physically disabled. My family lives in the country where good jobs are scarce. My father is hired at car wash, paying him about \$250 a month, and my mother works as a cashier to a little country store, she gets about the same amount as my father. Their total income is very small and utilities are high. Living expenses here are the same level as they pay in the western Europe countries but salaries very low here. Fortunately, we have a little garden that gives us some vegetables.

I wanted to attend a university to Bucharest or Timisoara where the living prices are much higher. Needless to say paying so much was not possible.

My dropping by the Life Center was a miracle from God. I had enrolled in a Timisoara university, and tried my best to support myself but when it came to the university classes schedule, I couldn't be free and available more than a couple of hours a day. I couldn't cover my whole expenses. My grandma helped a little from her own little pension, my mother took some of her wage money and some food from the very mouth of my siblings and sent it to help me out too. However, in less than one year because of continual shortages I was ready to give up the advanced education. I felt like a failure.

I was struggling with the bills and all my expenses but making good, better than average grades. I was ashamed of my own family, and begging money from my poor grandma, and asking more from my mother for the next few years of support. But while on vacation I didn't fully give up my belief thought, and as a last resort I starting to pray to God. I hoped He was up there to help and direct me on the path of life and what I should do. Vacation came quickly to a close and I became more worried. I thought God may not exist or He doesn't hear or honor my prayers, unworthy person I am, I may be too small and insignificant for Him.

I got more discouraged and ready to go back home, but decided to wait for another couple of days.

While walking around the university I met a fellow student from a class we took together. I told her of my bad situation, that I may not be able to go on for the second year. But right there in the middle of the street God provided the answer to my prayers. This friend had heard about the Life Center home assistance, one of her friend lives there. She went home and called me back giving me the Life Center phone number. With a tearful emotional trembling I dial the number. A man's voice answered. I introduced myself I told my big and sad story and that I'm in a grave life need. With a soft father's voice I heard not so good news from the Life Center director Constantin Prisacaru, he said, I'm very sorry but you may be too late. All beds are occupied now. However, if someone doesn't show up, a room may become vacant, then you will be the first one we call, so continue to pray.

The first day of the semester the Life Center director called and questioned me where I was. I told him that I'm still in Timisoara waiting and praying for his call. He said pack up and as soon as possible to show up at the Life Center office.

Arriving and with much thanks I was given a tour to show me the wonderful Life Center facilities. They took me to a clean and gorgeous nice room, introducing me to my two new roommates, who beautifully welcomed and hugged me like they had known me forever. I felt a little shy as if I was drawn out from troubled waters, rescued from drowning. Then the director told me, not to thank them so much but better give thanks to the Lord who made this room available just for you. For at this last moment, the Lord provided this bed for you.

Now, here on these grounds I came closer to the Lord, knowing Him personally, and really thanking Him out from the deepest of my heart! It is great to know really the Lord



of my life and His own wonderful people living here on this sinful earth!

But also thanking the director Constantin Prisacaru who didn't forget about me but with a father's heart was concerned about me a complete stranger, and inviting me in this great family of God!

Also to our Pastor John Dolinschi who everyone spoke about him around here, then I met him as he spoke and taught all of us here, a life practical lesson of how to walk daily with Jesus, and thanking him for his striving to make sure we're provided with everything we are needing here. And thank God for all the wonderful staff who serves greatly for us, feeding us with delicious meals that are being cooked in love.

But specially to Life Outreach International, James & Betty Robison, who built this great edifice for the glory of God. Brother John told us that LOI is still supporting us on a regular basis. PTL for this is the most worthy ministry I can imagine that may be still existing on this earth! May the Lord bless you richly my American brothers who make life for us here a little easier around the poor land of Romania!

Raising New Leaders and Pastors on the Harvest Field

The key to victory to these needy lost people is the raising up of new leaders to pastor them. Then to set them into the heavenly oasis here on the earth like; Life centers, youth-children camps or just a little church planted right where was most needed, in the midst of them, right where they are living.

Let's take the details of Alina's testimony who somehow ended up the Life Center. Add the related girl in the story whom she met on the street, her friend who was living in the Life Center is none other than Tabita who was rescued from the world of darkness. Tabita

was raised in the black poverty, unable to continue her college education and then was saved in the new planted church of her own town. After a while she was picked up and sent to the Life Center by a new fresh church leader named Nicu, himself had being newly saved and then trained up in the ministry of church leadership. What I'm presenting here is really a *Life change chain ministry* that works together as one living organism, much more than institutional organization may accomplish on this earth.

While spending time here, I give most of my time to the leadership training at Bible seminars, both locally or regionally and a couple of days seminar. I should be and need to go where these few prospecting leaders are living, as mostly they do not have the extra money to travel to where I am. They are too busy doing both the ministry and laboring to care and provide the food and clothing for their own families, and they are also too precious to be left alone or dropped where they are, let's stand to help and pray with them!

Pastor Romulus Paraluta Needing Project.

We just spoke up here about raising up new leaders for the evangelism and church planting harvesting mostly in the southern parts of Romania. Bishop Romulus is the regional bishop with the father's heart for many of these fresh generational leaders we are speaking about here. This letter sent in love to you, shows his compassionate heart ready to reach down and lift up any person in need of Christ, rescuing them from the rim of death,

sickness or materially downtrodden.

But, Pastor Romulus's car is disabled because of badly paved and gravel roads. He drives much to reach these people. It is now over a month since his *road partner car* was parked and out of use because the lack of funds to fix it. He has to take timing consuming walks, riding a bicycle or maybe finding someone to give him a quick ride here and there.

Pastor Romulus needs about \$700 to set the car up for the next running for the Kingdom of God.
